October 11, 2022 – 9:00 am.

CALL TO ORDER, INVOCATION, PLEDGE, AND ROLL CALL (0:00– 1:05)

The Council of the City of Jackson met in a regular session on Tuesday, October 11, 2022, at 9:00 am. Mayor Scott Conger called the meeting to order, and Ross Priddy led us in the invocation and Allegiance Pledge. The Mayor then called the roll. Councilmembers Ernest Brooks II, David Cisco, Johnny Dodd, Russ McKelvey, Ross Priddy, Tara Skinner, Paul Taylor, and Marda Wallace were present. ELECTION OF NEW COUNCILMEMBER TO REPLACE UNEXPIRED TERM OF GARY PICKENS (5:10 – 19:19)

Mayor Scott Conger said the candidates submitted their resumes to the council, and during the pre-agenda meeting we had the opportunity to asked questions and hear from them. The applicants are Ricky Brown, Kipp Hornburger, and Sam Turner. Mayor Conger asked the council do they want to her from them again or nominate. Councilmember David Cisco nominated Sam Turner, and Councilmember Ernest Brooks nominated Ricky Brown. He also reminded the council to vote only for one, and he will call their names out alphabetically.

Upon a call for a vote for Mr. Ricky Brown, Councilmember Brooks voted aye; upon a call for a vote for Mr. Sam Turner, Councilmember Dodd, Cisco, McKelvey, Priddy, Skinner, Taylor, and Wallace voted aye. Mr. Sam Turner will represent District 1 for the remainder of Gary Pickens's term. Judge Kyle Atkins swore him in, and a brief recess was given.

Mayor Scott Conger reminded the audience this was a public hearing. Therefore, please raise your hand at the appropriate time for anyone wishing to speak in favor of or opposition to any item on the first reading.

Councilmember Dodd made a motion, seconded by Councilmember McKelvey, to approve the agenda item as submitted. Upon a call for a vote, all voted aye, except Turner; the motion passed 8-0-1.

2. Proposed Budget Amendment- City Pension Plan \$10,913 (42:34 – 44:22)

Councilmember Cisco made a motion, seconded by Councilmember Taylor, to approve the agenda item as submitted. The Mayor asked if anyone had a public comment, there were none. Upon a call for a vote, all voted aye, the motion passed unanimously.

3. Proposed Budget Amendment- ARPA \$0 (44:23 – 45:34)

Councilmember McKelvey made a motion, seconded by Councilmember Taylor, to approve the agenda item as submitted. The Mayor asked if anyone had a public comment, there was none. Upon a call for a vote, all voted aye, the motion passed unanimously.

2. Proposed Budget Amendment- City Employee Back Pay \$116,636 (45:56 – 46:12)

Councilmember Dodd made a motion, seconded by Councilmember McKelvey, to approve the agenda item as submitted. Upon a call for a vote, all voted aye, the motion passed unanimously.

3. Consideration of an Ordinance to Amend Title 17 –Refuse and Disposal Ordinance for the City of Jackson, TN (46:13 – 46:43)

Councilmember Cisco made a motion, seconded by Councilmember Wallace to approve the agenda item as submitted. Upon a call for a vote, all voted aye, the motion passed unanimously.

Councilmember Skinner made a motion, seconded by Councilmember Taylor, to approve the agenda item as submitted. Upon a call for a vote, all voted aye, except Cisco voted nay; the motion passed 8-0-1.

Councilmember Dodd made a motion, seconded by Councilmember Cisco, to approve the agenda item as submitted. Upon a call for a vote, all voted aye, the motion passed unanimously.

3. Consideration of an extension of the Management agreement with First Transit for JTA (49:31 – 49:57)

Councilmember Dodd made a motion, seconded by Councilmember Taylor, to approve the agenda item as submitted. Upon a call for a vote, all voted aye, the motion passed unanimously.

Councilmember Wallace made a motion, seconded by Councilmember Dodd, to approve the agenda item as submitted. Upon a call for a vote, all voted aye, except Priddy, who abstained; the motion passed 8-0-1.
